Information technology (IT) specialists serve as support to branch offices and administrative offices in all phases of technology used by employees. They assist in administering and maintaining technical infrastructure that includes but is not limited to: customer servers, switches, routers, desktops, laptops and networks where applicable, as needed to support technical services systems and IT structure.

- Perform maintenance and troubleshooting on company devices
- Ensure devices are secure from cyber threats
- Install and support software programs
- Provide training and support to employees
